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Purpose

The two purposes of this documentare:

- x Definition of and information about Internal ERE Researchand the principles guiding its conduct
- x Definition of and guideline applicable o Externa Research, ow application can be submitted to meet the requirements and expectations of the EREA governing body.
- 2. Definitions

Approvalmeans the consent granted by a Principal for a Researcher conducted Research their School or entity.

Endorsement for Research means that the REA Research Assessment Panel has found that the Researcher who wishes to conduct Research has met the threshold for the conduct of safe and appropriate Research

The Research Assessment Panel is guided in its assessment by the principles of the *National Statement on Ethical Conduct in Human Research* (NationalStatement) Asthe governingauthority of EREA Schools, EREA also considers:

- x How the researchprocessmay benefit EREASchools and the value of the potential research outcomes to our Schools and network
- x If the demand and interruption to Schools may outweigh any potential benefit, or significan disrupt the work of Schools (ie learning and teaching)
- x Thealignment (or possible misalignment) than authentic Catholic anthropology of the man person, and EREA's strategic directions, programs and approaches to supporting its Schools
- x The potential risks to our young people, staff, families, Schools and jurisdiction in the conduct of the Research, reporting of findings, and achievement of EREA' mission and strategy
- x Howpotential riskswill be preventedor minimised
- x The appropriateness of conducting the Researchin a Schoolsetting.

The ERE Research Assessment anelwill make a recommendation to the ERE Anational Executive, which will make the decision as to whether the proposed Research is approved or not approved.

# 4. Research that does NOT require EREA Endorsement

EREÆndorsementsNOTrequired:

- 1. From school staff undertaking Research in their own SCHOOL for the purposes of ongoing learning, reflection and improvement, and with no intention to publish the findings in the public domain.
- Where External Research is being conducted by student researchers wishing to conduct Researchaspart of undergraduatestudyor postgraduatestudyat diploma, honoursor masters level, their own institutions are obliged to manage the research compliance process and students may not enter EREA sites without the approval documentation from their accrediting university's HREC.
- 3. If the Researchmeetsall of the following criteria:
  - a) Isappropriate for a student researche to conduct in School/s(ie the topic is not sensitive according to Section 9 Risk, and the methodology is not intrusive)
  - b) Is 'negligible'or 'low' risk Researchaccording to the <u>NationalStatement</u>, and therefore highly unlikely to raise concerns for participants, or the school community
  - c) Is supervised by an experienced Researcher and given ethical clear and by the relevant institution
  - d) Minimisesanyrisk of participants beingidentified given the smalls amplesizes associated with student research.

Studentresearcherswho

- x Thereis a financial cost to participate in the Research
- x Schoolsand/or participantsare not provided with adequate information, and appropriate consent is not sought
- x The Research is not adequately monitored by an ethics committee, and findings reported in the public domain are not subject to a pererview process.

### 8. Application & documentation

8.1 PrincipalLetter

EREA Endorsement is not an Approval, but an indication to Schools that the Research is ethically sound and meets EREA requirements. EREA Endorsement carries with piectration of or preference for participation. It is ultimately the Principal's Approval which determines whether their School participates in the Research or not. Principal Approval must be sought before the Research can begin any participants are contract. An introductory letter should be provided which clearly outlines:

- x the purpose of the Research
- x overalltimeline
- x who the participants will be and what they are expected to do (ie methods)
- x time demandfor eachactivity
- x any schoolesources equired
- x how the Principalisto communicate their Approval (egattached consent form or reply email)
- x the researchinstruments to be used (seepoint 6.3)
- x plain languagestatements
- x consentforms
- x and any other documents to be provided to participants.

#### 8.2 Plain languagetatements

Plainlanguagestatements(PLS\$houldbeprovidedfor eachparticipanttype, and clearly state:

- x the purpose of the Research, what the participant will be asked to do
- x the time demandfor eachactivity
- x how their data and identity will be protected
- x the processor withdrawingif they no longerwishto participate and/or want their data removed

Final versions are strongly preferred and are less likely to delay EREA Endorsement. Occasionally Researchers may not bable to provide the final instrument because it is dependent on early researchfindings,howeveranindicativedraft is still required. If the researchtopic and method is not sensitive nor intrusive, EREA may be able to provide Endorsement on the draft versions. However, it is more likely EREA will request submission of final copies before Endorsements issued, or that particular phase of the Research commences.

### 8.4 Ethicsapproval

Ethics committee approvalion the Researcher's espective university or organisation required before EREA wildsue Endorsement. The Researcher's university or organisation will generally be expected to be listed in the <u>NHMRCRegistry</u> Researchers ay submittheir application to EREA while their institution's ethics approvalis still pending, however it is preferred that the research proposal and documentation submitted to EREA already incorporates ethics committee feedback.

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#### 8.9 ApproachingSchools

Once an application imporved, Researchers can approach PrincipatisRin A Schools invititingem to participate.Principalsthen decidewhether the Researchwill add value to their schoolcommunity and give informed consent.Principal consentmust be granted before the Research can be give participant is approached.

## 8.10 Amendments

If Researchersvishto makechangesto their application, either before or after it has been approved,

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- x sensitive culturalissuesrace, ethniddentity, religiousbeliefsor world views
- x gambling, alcohol use, llicit druguse, criminal activity or anti-social behaviour
- x diseaseor healthissues(mental, physicabr social)
- x fertility, pregnancyparenting(includingchildrenandyoungpeople'sattitudestowardsparenting).

A research projectnay also deemed greatethan low risk if the methodology is intrusive (either physically or emotionally), and if vulnerable participants are being recruited. By definition, all young people in EREA Flexi Schools are considered to bieuplarly vulnerable participants.

If Researchersvish to conduct Researchin Schoolsthat is deemedgreater than low risk, they must demonstrate:

- x they have the necessary qualifications and experience to manage the research project
- x they are aware of relevantethical and legal obligations
- x howpotentialriskswill be

with (egbeingvideorecorded, having their height and weight measure dr their data being used in future Research).

## 12 PassiveConsent

Passiveconsentrefersto an 'opt-out' model of consent—following full disclosure of the nature and scope of the Research. As most young people of settingeolare minors, the consent of their parents or guardians is also necessary. It may be, in instances of Research which is of negligible or low risk, acceptable that parental consent is passive, but the acceptability of this will be assessed on a case by-case basis. Passive consent will only be approved if the following elements of the proposed Research have been fully disclosed to parents and guardians:
