Torres Strait Islander	The Torres Strait Islands are a group of over 200 small islands in the Torres Strait of the Australian mainland's northern most point. There are seventeen inhabited islands and two communit es located at the t p of Cape York that are classified as a part of the Torres Strait. The Torres Strait is the waterway that separates Australia and Papua New Guinea. From the waters of the Strait, where the Coral and Arafura Seas meet in one of the most fragile and intricate waterways in the world, rise hundreds of islands, islets, cays, reefs and sandbanks. All these are traditionally named, owned and used. No two islands are identical, each being shaped by its unique landscape, stories and history. The Torres Strait Islander peoples along with Aboriginal peoples are the Indigenous peoples of Australia, two very distinct cultural groups. (AIATSIS website)
